Geographical and Social Conditions	<p>Yunnan Province is located in the southwestern part of China, bordering the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region and Guizhou Province in the east, Sichuan Province and the Tibet Autonomous Region in the north, Myanmar in the west, and Laos and Vietnam in the south.</p> <p>The area is home to world heritage sites such as the Old Town of Lijiang, the Three Parallel Rivers of the Yunnan Protected Areas, and the Stone Forest.</p> <p>The province is known as the place of origin of abundant floricultural plants, in addition to pu-erh tea.</p>	
Resource Distribution	<p>The existence of about 150 types of nonferrous metal resources has been confirmed in the province. Of those nonferrous metal resources, reserves of about 50 types fall under the top 10 reserves in China. The reserves of zinc, tin, and phosphorus are the largest in the country.</p>	
Major Industries	<p>Biopharmaceuticals, manufacture of cigarettes, nonferrous metal, tourism</p>	
Infrastructure	Railways	<p>The area is home to the Chengkun Railway (Chengdu–Kunming), Hukun Railway (Shanghai–Kunming), Nankun Railway (Nanning–Kunming), and the Kunhe Railway connecting Yunnan to the boundary with Vietnam, etc. The Shanghai–Kunming High-speed Railway is under construction and is scheduled to be available along its entire line in 2015. The Kunyu Railway (Kunming–Yuxi) is being extended. The construction of a high-speed railway (Kunming–Bangkok) is currently being projected.</p>

	Expressways	The area is home to the Jingkun Expressway (Beijing –Kunming), Yukun Expressway (Chongqing–Kunming), Hukun Expressway (Shanghai–Kunming), and Guangkun Expressway (Guangzhou–Kunming), etc. The Longling-Ruili section of the Kunming-Ruili Expressway is under construction, of which completion will shorten the travel time from Kunming to Ruili to 8 hours. The opening of an expressway crossing the border into Vietnam (in October 2014) shortens travel time from Kunming to Hanoi to 8 hours.	
	Airports	The area is home to Kunming Changshui International Airport, Lijiang Sanyi Airport, Dali Airport, Diqing Shangri-La Airport, Dehong Mangshi Airport, Baoshan Yunduan Airport, Pu'er Simao Airport, Zhaotong Airport, Wenshan Airport, Lincang Airport, and Tengchong Airport. The expansion of Kunming Changshui International Airport is underway.	
	Subways	Kunming Rail Transit Line 1, Line 2, and the section of Line 6, which was completed during first-phase construction, are in operation. Line 3 and Line 9 are under construction, and the construction for Line 4 and Line 5 is in the planning stage.	
Transportation and Access	Rail	It takes approximately 29 hours from Kunming to Shanghai and approximately 36 hours from Kunming to Beijing.	
	Air	International flights operate from Kunming Changshui International Airport to Singapore, Hanoi, Kuala Lumpur, Jakarta, and Bangkok, etc.
