The accompanying consolidated financial statements expressed in U.S. dollars have been translated into dollars solely for the convenience of the reader. We have recomputed the translation and, in our opinion, the consolidated financial statements expressed in Japanese yen have been translated into U.S. dollars on the basis described in note 1 to the consolidated financial statements.
